




Intakes Received by State Fiscal Year



Intakes, or reports of child maltreatment, may be directed to investigation, family support, screened out, or screened out and referred to services. Other intakes, such as Information and Referrals, are not included in these counts. (Data Source: SHINES)




Open Family Support Stages



Family support cases are opportunities to assist families where concerns exist but can be managed with only minimal DFCS involvement, usually through referrals to community services. (Data Source: SHINES)




Open Investigations



Investigations seek to determine the safety of children where an allegation of abuse or neglect has been received by DFCS. This measure helps DFCS to measure workloads. (Data Source: SHINES)



Open Family Preservation Stages




Family preservation is a program designed to continue working with a family where safety concerns have been identified with the children remaining in the home. (Data Source: SHINES)



Foster Children/Youth in Custody on Last Day of Month


■ Age: 0 to 17 ■ Age: 18 to 22



This chart shows the number of children in foster care on the last day of each month. Efforts are made immediately upon entry to pursue reunification when possible. A portion of the decline in the number of foster children over the past two years is due to the efforts by DFCS to exhaust all possible alternatives to entry. (Data Source: SHINES)




Children in Custody By State Fiscal Year



Children may have been in foster care for only part of the year. Each child is counted only once in a year, regardless of the number of foster episodes. Individual children may be counted in more than one year. (Data Source: SHINES)




Reunifications SFY 2017 - June 2023



This chart shows the counts and percentages of reunifications that have occurred each of the past five years. By policy, a re unification is, “The return of a child in the temporary custody of DFCS to the legal and physical custody of the parent, guardian or legal custodian. Custody to a non-custodial parent is also deemed reunification.” (Data Source: SHINES)





Adoptions by State Fiscal Year



In cases where reunification is not in the best interest of the child, it becomes DFCS' goal to find a loving adoptive home for each child in need. These adoption counts show the continuous effort undertaken to help children in foster care find forever homes. (Data Source: SHINES)



Among children who entered care in a 12-month period, the number of placement moves per day they experienced during that year




Reentry to Foster Care




Among children who discharged to permanency (excluding adoption) in a 12-month period, the percent who reentered care within 12 months of exit




Permanency Statewide Data Indicators

 - During National Foster Care Month, DHS hosted a statewide celebration to honor the 2023 Foster Caregivers of the Year.

Users can drill into each location to review detailed information.







Medicaid




Unduplicated Families Served Across All Programs


Caseload Size


Front Line Staffing Levels

SNAP Issuance




SNAP issuance in July 2023 totaled **\$268,216,814**. The average issuance per family was **\$371**.


SNAP Families


SNAP Applications and Renewals Processed


Active Medical Assistance Families

Total Medical Assistance Applications Processed




TANF Issuance


TANF Work Mandatory vs Payee Only Cases



Proposed Bylaw Amendment

(to be inserted in Article III: Members)

Section 6. Should an Advisory Board Member have a concern that relates to their role as an Advisory Board member, the following communication process is requested:

1. If related to an issue or topic covered by Board committees, a Board member should bring the concern to the appropriate Committee Chair. The Committee Chair can then bring the concern to Chair of the Board if issue cannot be resolved.
2. If the concern is not related to a committee topic but falls more broadly under operations or programming, the member is asked to bring it to the Chair. The Chair of the Board will then reach out to the Board Liaison and other Division Leadership, as appropriate.
