






# Federal Performance Indicators Three Year Trend






# State Performance Indicators FFY 2020 and FFY 2021





# Paternity Establishment Percentage (PEP)


Statewide PEP 2021 - 2022 Monthly Comparison












Family Support Cases are opportunities to assist families where concerns exist but can be managed with only minimal DFCS involvement, usually through referrals to community services.

Investigations seek to determine the safety of children where an allegation of abuse or neglect has been received by DFCS. This measure helps DFCS to measure workloads.







Family Preservation is a program designed to continue working with a family where safety concerns have been identified with the children remaining in the home.




This chart shows the number of children in active Family Preservation cases at the end of the month. If not for this program, many of these children would otherwise be in foster care.



Voluntary Kinship is an innovation used by DFCS over the past several years to provide a safe haven for children involved in an investigation before a final determination can be made regarding the need for foster care.




This chart shows the number of children in foster care on the last day of each month. Efforts are made immediately upon entry to pursue reunification when possible. A portion of the decline in the number of foster children over the past two years is due to the efforts by DFCS to exhaust all possible alternatives to entry.



This chart compares for each month the number of entries and exits into foster care. Note that children that turn 18 are considered an "exit" in this chart, even if they sign back into custody. The chart only includes children under age 18.

Finding a forever family for each child is the goal of DFCS when it is clear that reunification will not be in the best interest of the child. These adoption counts by month show the continuous effort undertaken to help foster children achieve this goal.




#### Unduplicated Families Served Across All Programs

#### Caseload Size








SNAP Issuance in October was \$281,482,017. Average issuance per family was \$379. Source: DFCS Transparency Data


#### **SNAP Families**


#### SNAP Applications and Renewals Processed


#### Active Medical Assistance Families




#### Total Medical Assistance Applications Processed






TANF Issuance in October was \$1,460,232. Average issuance per family was \$262. Source: DFCS Transparency Data




#### TANF Work Mandatory vs Payee Only Cases

## Rule Change Procedure

- 1. Board Considers Motion to Publish Proposed Rule
- 2. 30-Day Public Comment Period
- 3. Public Hearing
- 4. Motion for Final Adoption of Proposed Rule
- 5. Send Final Rule to Secretary of State



## Initial - Child-Placing Agencies

Rule changes needed to eliminate the need for providers to request waivers of certain regulatory requirements and to make certain regulatory requirements less burdensome for providers

#### Current Rule:

- 290-9-2-.01 Definitions
- 290-9-2-.04 Criminal History Background Checks, Agency Personnel
- 290-9-2-.07 Foster Care Services

Rule Published December 5 - January 4

#### Proposed Change:

- Clarifies foster home capacity
- Updates minimum qualifications for casework supervisor
- Adds new rule that outlines exceptions to foster home capacity


