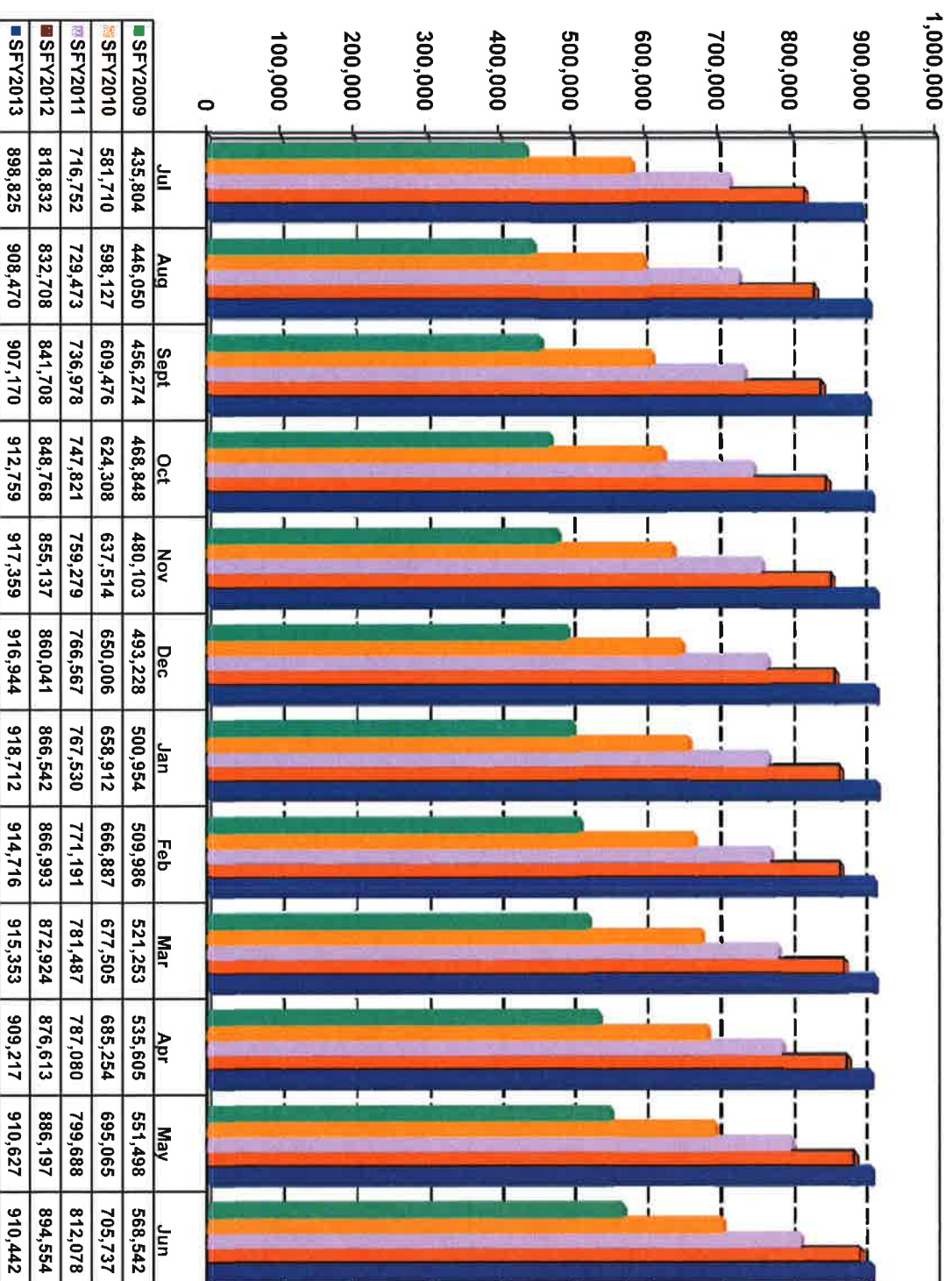

CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Child Protective Services (CPS) staff investigates report of child abuse or neglect and provides services to protect the child and strengthen the family.

DATA TABLE DESCRIPTION:

GEORGIA CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES

SUBSTANTIATED: An investigation disposition by a CPS investigator concludes, based on a preponderance of evidence collected, that the allegation of mistreatment, as defined by state law and CPS procedure requirements, is true.

UNSUBSTANTIATED: An investigation disposition by a CPS investigator concludes that, under state law and CPS procedure requirements, there is either no collected evidence or less than a preponderance of evidence to substantiate that maltreatment occurred.

SCREENED-OUT REFERRAL: A report to CPS that does not contain the components of a CPS report. The report is logged, documented on Form 453 (Child Abuse/Neglect Worksheet) and an IDS form (Internal Data System) is completed. A referral to available resources may be made.

FAMILY SUPPORT: The process for determining need and providing support without formal CPS intervention.

PROCEDURE:

The number of cases is total for the SFY by category for each county. Total Cases Investigated is the sum of substantiated cases, plus unsubstantiated cases. The number of reports (Screened-Out and Diversions) is total for the SFY by category for each county. Total Reports is the sum of Total Cases Investigated plus Screened-Out and Diversions. The State Total is the sum of each category.
