**Outcome I: Child Protective Services Cases**

Count of unique CPS Investigations and Family Preservation (Ongoing) stages open at any point during the month. Includes all cases active at some time during the month. Outcome is calculated 45 days prior to the date of report.

Outcome 1A: Family Support Cases Only: Count of unique Family Support stages open at any point during the month.

Outcome 1B: Family Preservation Cases Only: Count of unique Family Preservation stages open at any point during the month.

Outcome 1C: Investigation Cases Only: Count of unique Investigation stages open at any point during the month.

**Outcome II: Recurrence of Substantiated Child Maltreatment**

Of all the children who were victims of substantiated maltreatment in the first 6 months of the year, the percentage that had substantiated maltreatment within the following 6 months. Outcome is calculated 45 days prior to the date of report. Each month is calculated as a rolling calendar year. *National Standard: less than or equal to 5.40%*

**Outcome III: Disposition of Child Abuse and Neglect Reports**

Chart reflects the disposition of reports received in a particular month. Data includes count of Family Support, Substantiated Investigations, Unsubstantiated Investigations and Screen-outs. Outcome is calculated 45 days prior to the date of report.

**Outcome IV: Subsequent Case-type of Investigations by Disposition**

Chart reflects the disposition of investigations received in a particular month by the subsequent case type. Data includes count of Family Preservation (Substantiated and Unsubstantiated Open), Foster Care (Substantiated and Unsubstantiated Open), Substantiated and Unsubstantiated Closed. Outcome is calculated 45 days prior to the date of report.

Of all the children who entered foster care, the percentage that were discharged from a prior episode of foster care within 12 months of the current foster care placement. National Standard: less than or equal to 8.60%.

**Outcome X: Length of Time to Achieve Reunification**

Percentage of children who exited care during the month through reunification with their family that reunified in less than 12 months from the date of their removal. National Standard: greater than or equal to 76.20%

Of all children in DFCS custody, the percentage that are placed with a relative or a relative foster home.

Count of unique children who were in the legal custody of DFCS (17 years of age and under) on the last day of the month who had a legal status of permanent court, permanent voluntary or joint custody permanent.

**Outcome XIV: Stability Performance Coefficient (Number of Moves/Number of Days in Custody \* 1000)**

A calculated value based upon the ACF CFSR Round 3 which is part of Program Improvement. It is calculated from a rolling 12 month population of the entry cohort where the child remained in custody for over 8 days and was not 18 on the date of removal. The federal standard is 4.12.

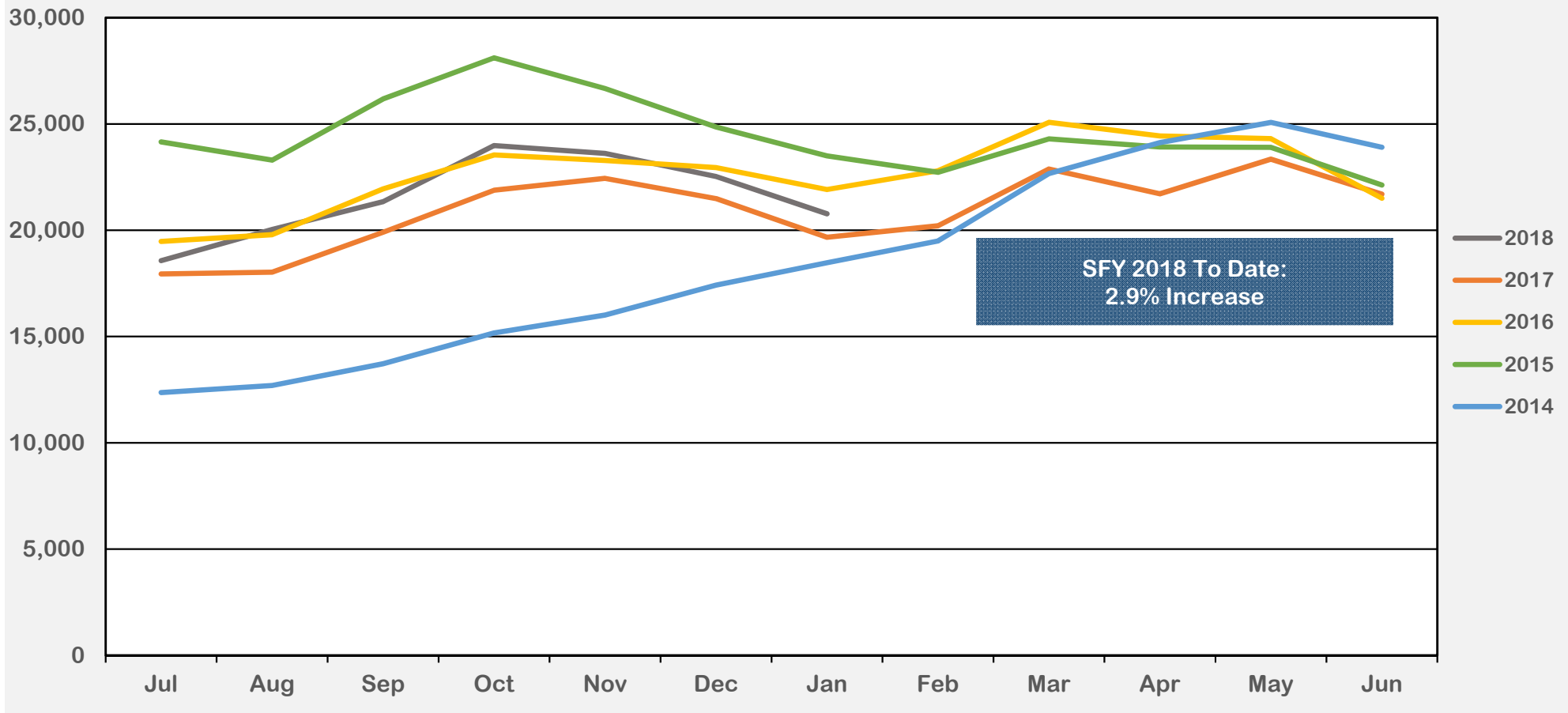

## Outcome I: Child Protective Services Cases (State Fiscal Year 2018 To Date)

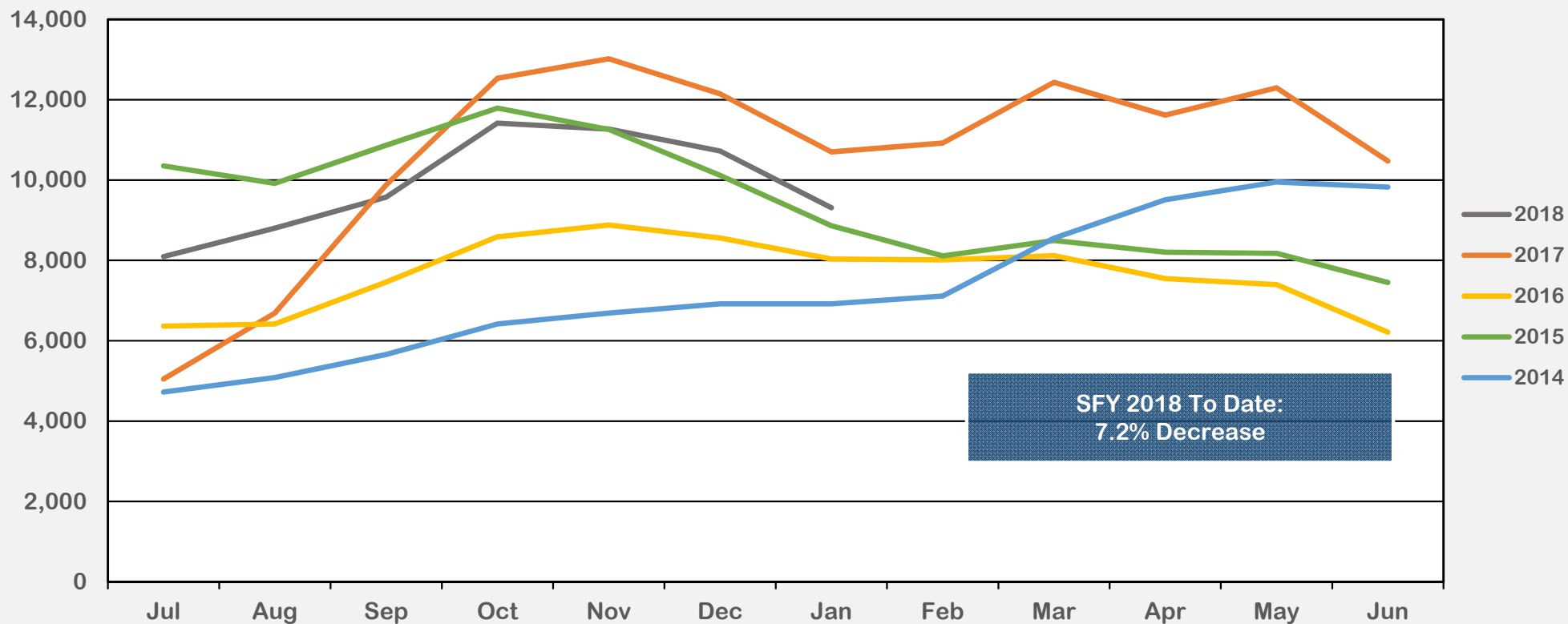
The average for the State Fiscal Year 2018 To Date reveals an increase of 2.9% since last State Fiscal Year. During the month of January 2018, there was a decrease in the total cases of 7.8% since December 2017. Comparatively, Georgia had 5.6% increase in cases in January 2017 as compared to January 2018.

### Outcome IA: Child Protective Services Cases Family Support Cases Only (State Fiscal Year 2018 To Date)

Family Support cases continued to decrease since October 2017 by 18.4% in January 2018 with an overall improvement in the average cases of 7.2% decrease for the State Fiscal Year 2018 to date over State Fiscal Year 2017. The chart reveals that there was an increase in SFY 2017's case average of 39.5% over the prior SFY. SFY 2016's case average revealed a decrease of 19.4% over SFY 2015.

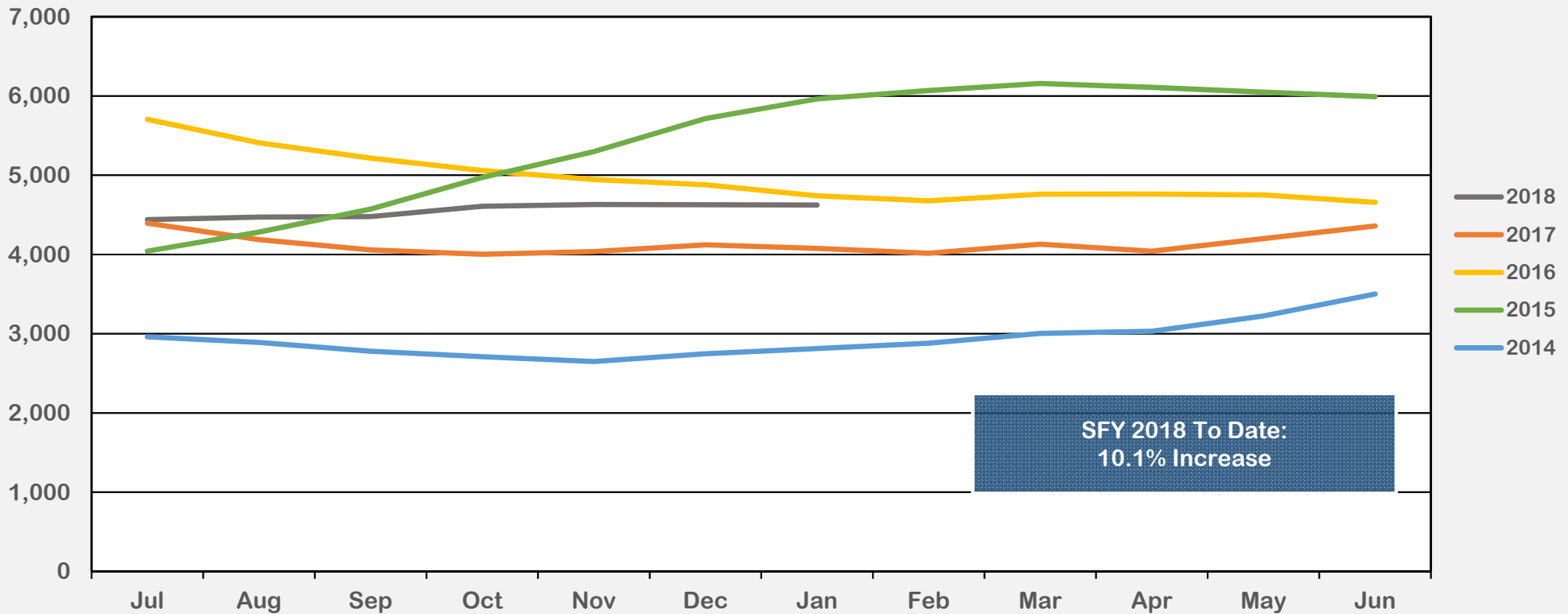

### Outcome IB: Child Protective Services Cases Family Preservation Cases Only (State Fiscal Year 2018 To Date)

Through January 2018 (SFY 2018 to date), there was a 10.1% increase in the number of Family Preservation cases since SFY 2017. Caseloads decreased from August 2016 – October 2016 with case counts remaining constant through April 2017 and increasing for the final two months of SFY 2017. The data revealed that SFY 2017 has an average that is 16.7% lower than SFY 2016’s average. State Fiscal Years 2016, 2017, and 2018 to date have consistently lower averages in Family Preservation Cases than SFY 2015.

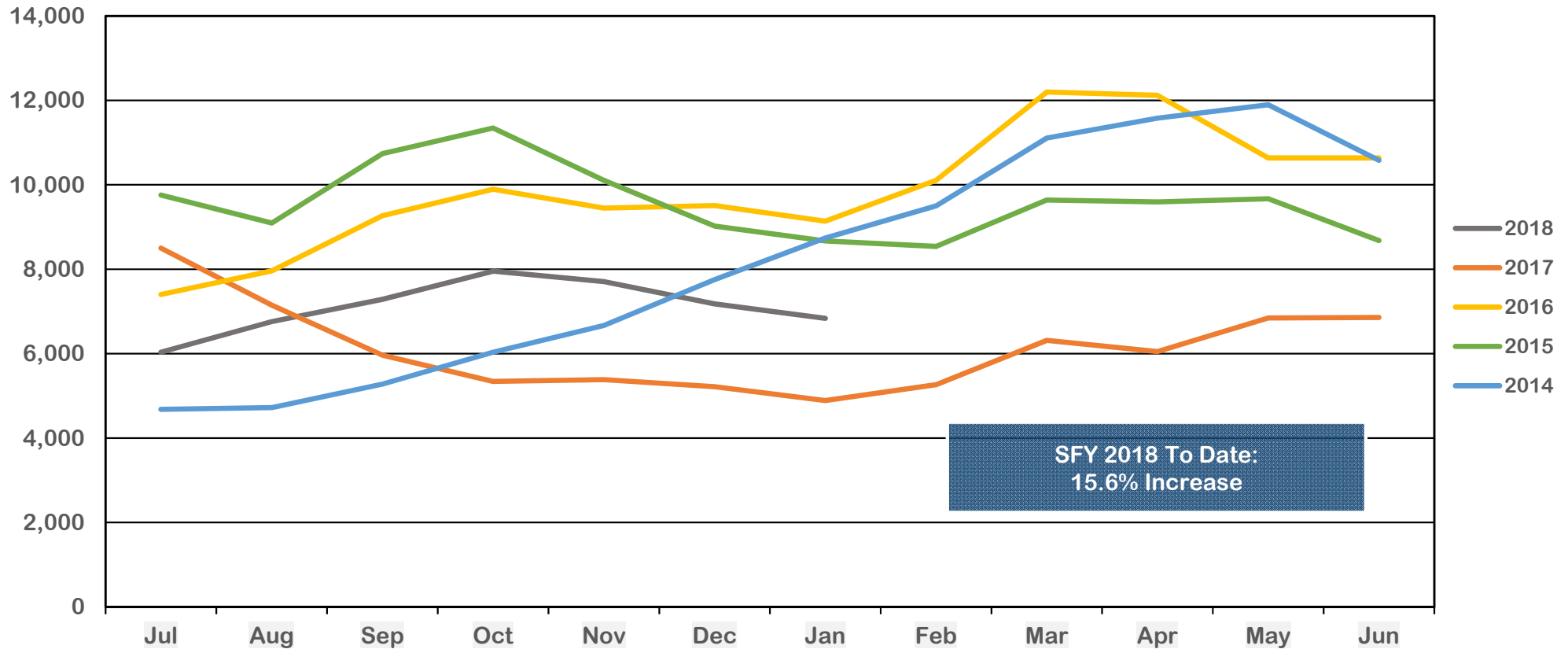

## Outcome IC: Child Protective Services Cases Investigation Cases Only (State Fiscal Year 2018 To Date)

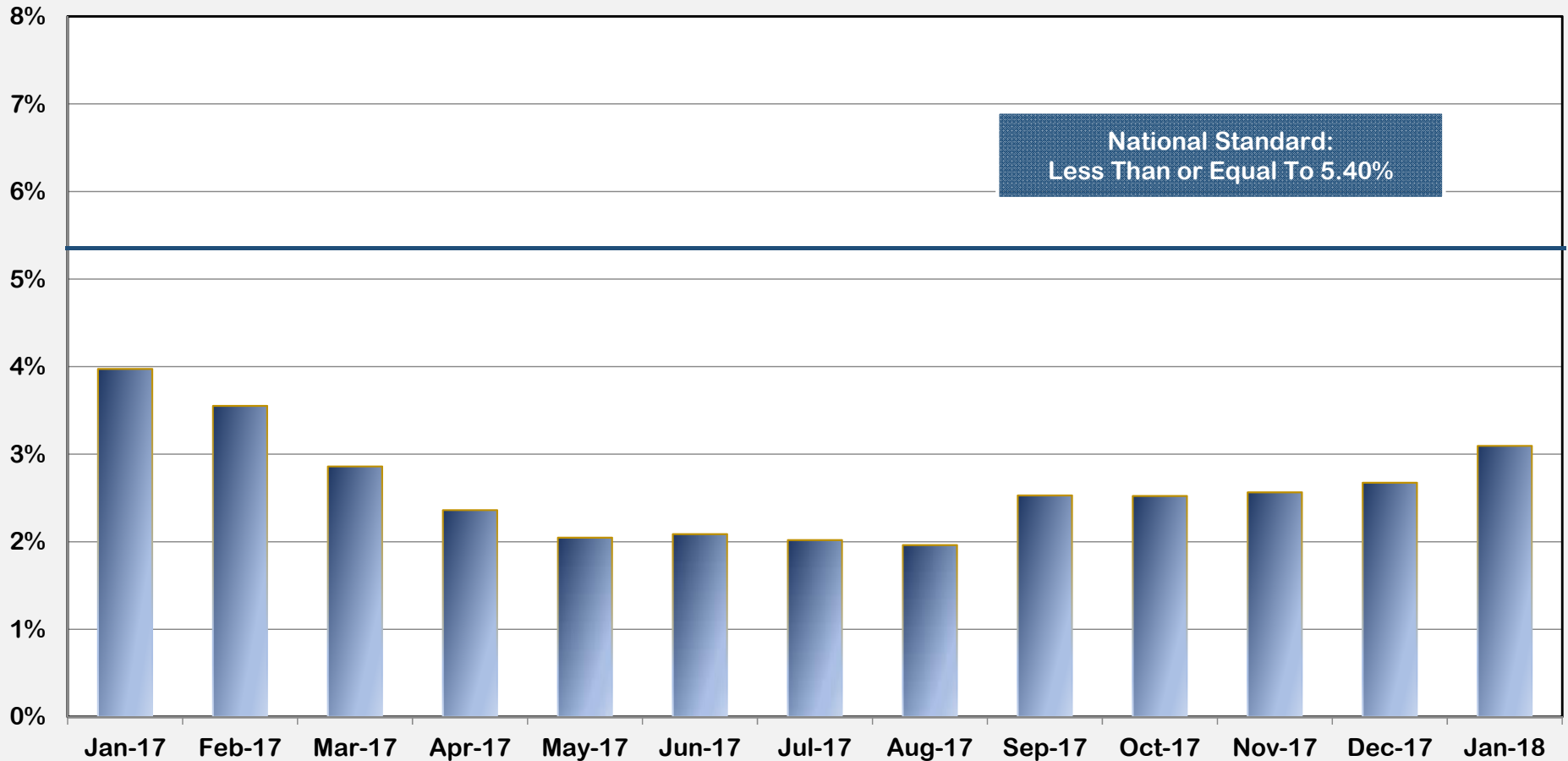
Since the beginning of SFY 2018 Investigation cases have shown a 15.6% increase in average caseloads over SFY 2017. During July 2017, there was a 12% decrease over June 2017 cases, followed by increases in August through October of 32% and decreases through January 2018. Investigation cases declined during the first semester through January 2017 by 43% during SFY 2017. A similar trend is seen from SFY 2014 – SFY 2017 of an increase from February – March.

## Outcome II: Recurrence of Substantiated Child Maltreatment (January 2017 – January 2018)

The trend below reveals a decrease in the number of repeated substantiated incidents of child maltreatment. During January 2017, Georgia was below the national standard of 5.4%. One year later this ratio is reduced by over 22% reflecting many effective changes that have been implemented in Child Protective Services.

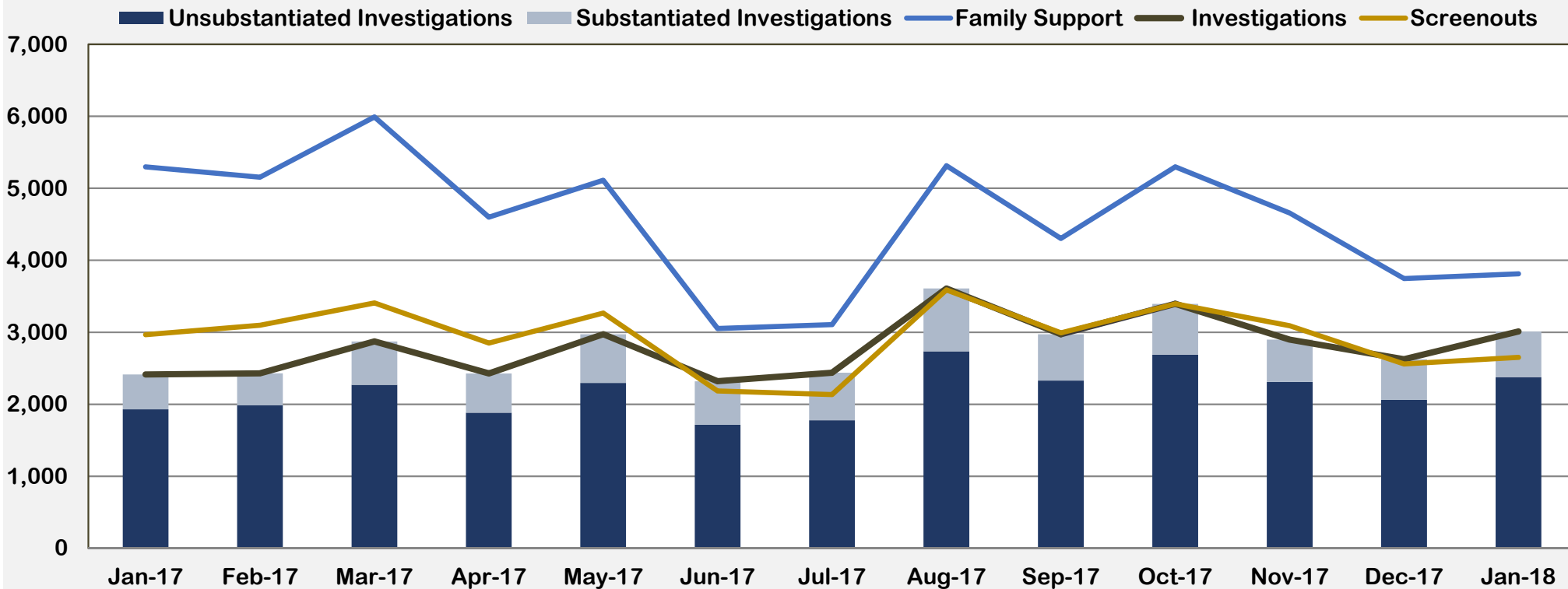

## Outcome III: Disposition of Child Abuse and Neglect Reports (January 2017 – January 2018)

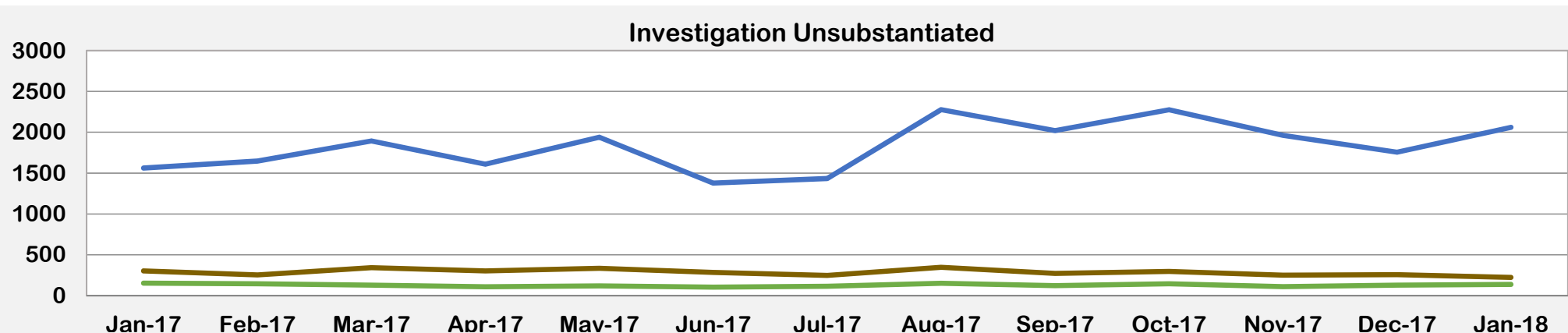
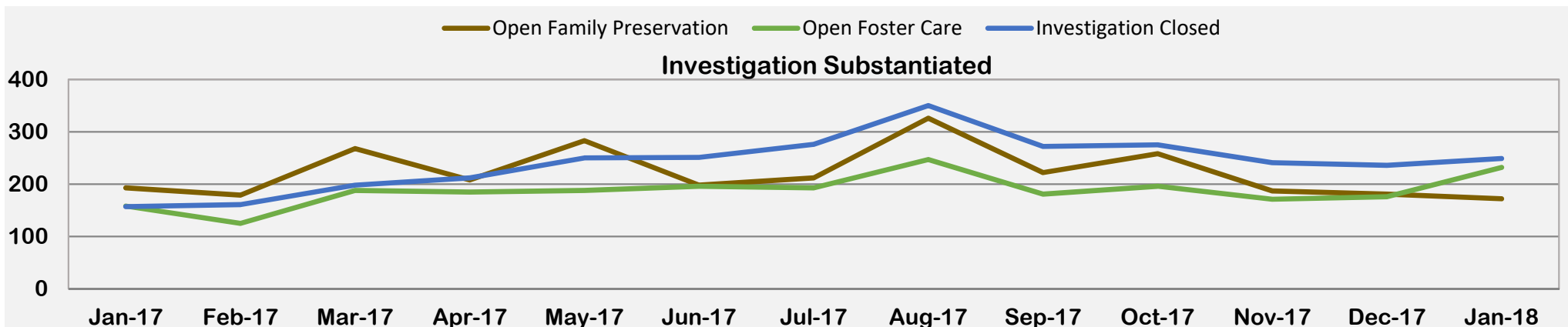
Of the CPS cases that had a disposition during the month of January 2018: 40.2% were Family Support; 28.0% were screen outs; and 31.8% were Investigations. Only 21.0% of Investigations were substantiated. The overall yearly trend shows the number of CPS Dispositions resulting in Family Support cases were higher through January 2018. Dispositions of CPS Cases that were Screened Out cases, while lower than Family Support were less than investigations in June, July, August of 2017 and January 2018. Total investigations increased through March 2017 with fluctuations marked by an increase in August and October 2017 with decreases in November and December 2017. Comparatively, there were more investigations and substantiations (31% more) in January 2018 than January 2017.

According to January 2018's data: 12.9% of Investigations were subsequently opened as a Family Preservation case; 12.1% of Investigations were opened as a Foster Care case; and 75% of Investigations were closed.

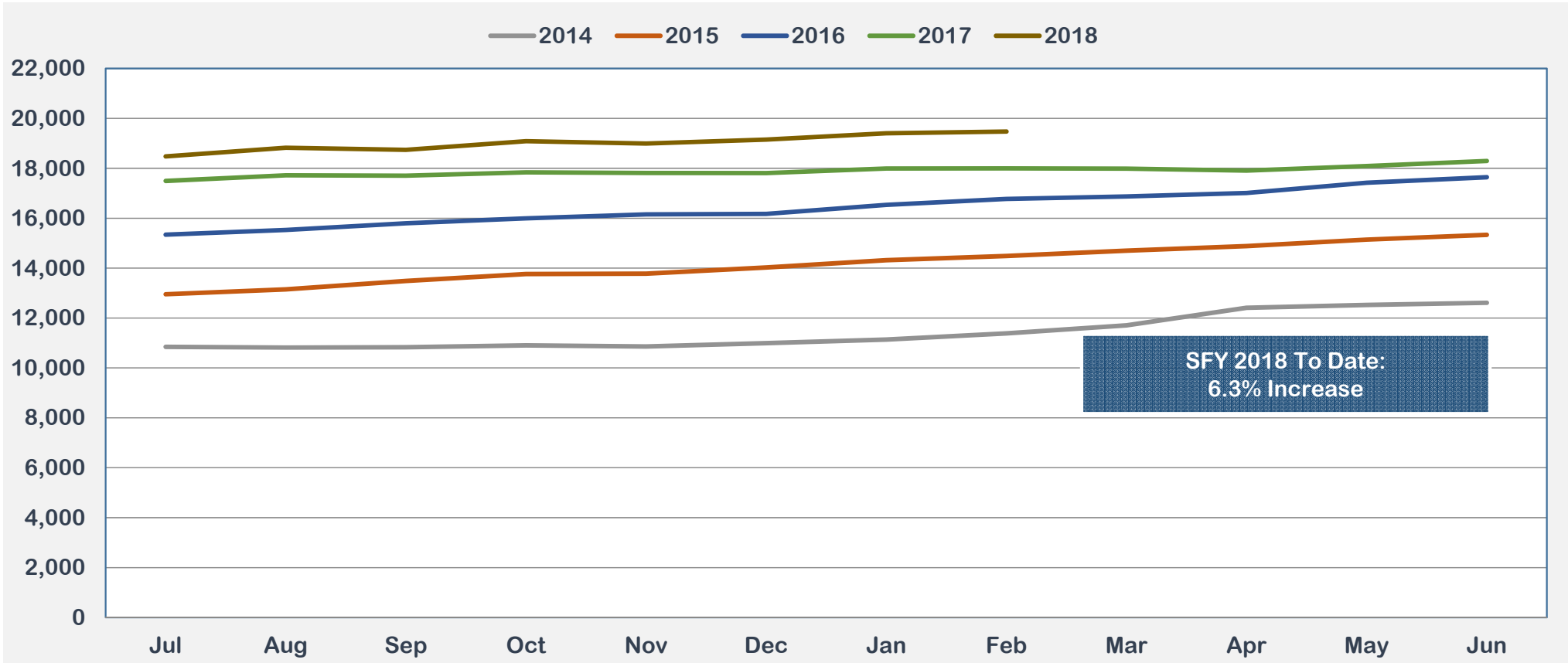

## Outcome V: Number of Children in Placement Services (State Fiscal Year 2018 To Date)

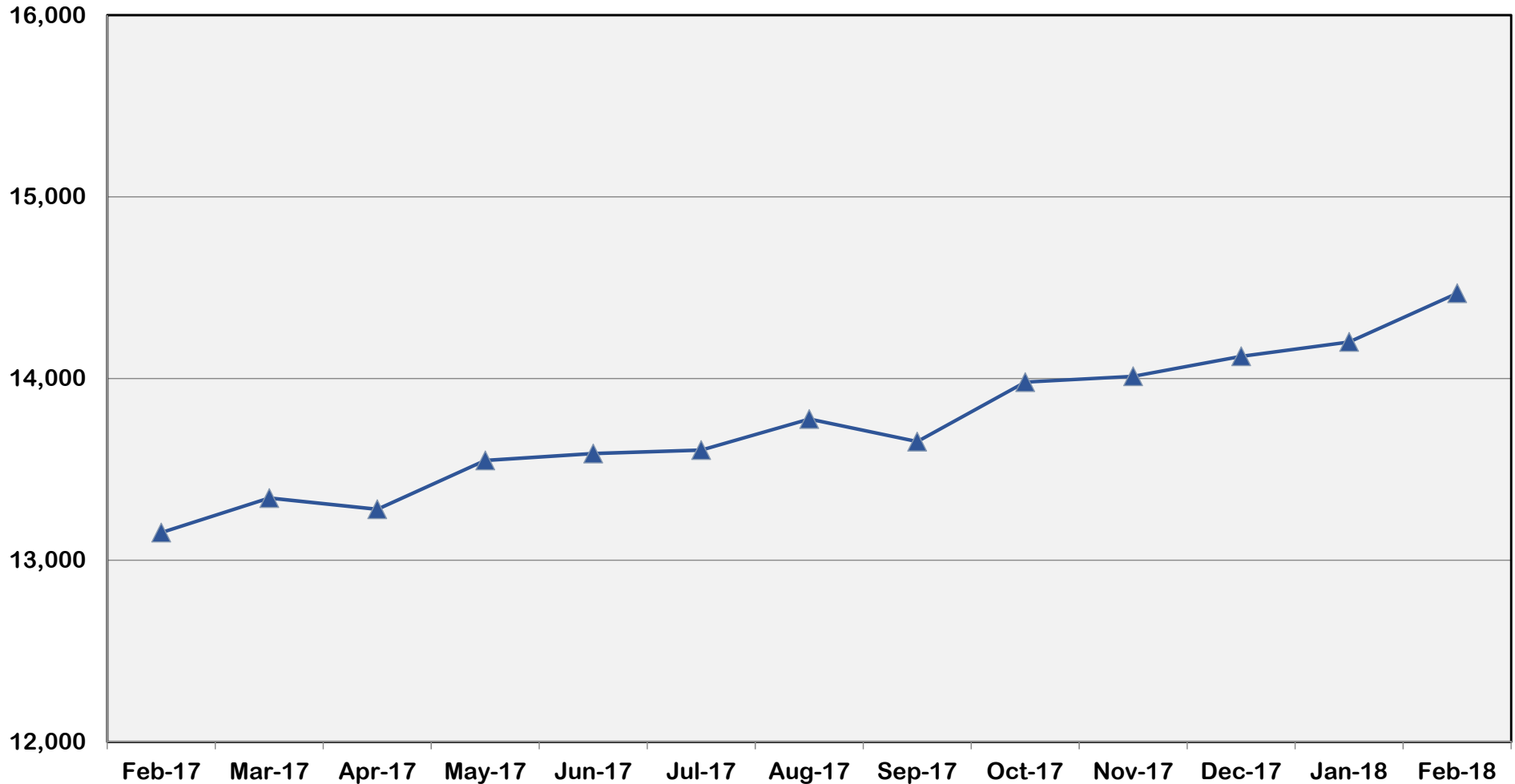
There was a slight increase in the number of placement services that were open during the month of February 2018 (19,473). The placement services include continued collaboration with families after out of home care may have ended as well as those who are in out of home care with DFCS Age 0 - 21.

### Outcome VI: Children in DFCS Custody Under the Age of 18 (February 2017 – February 2018)

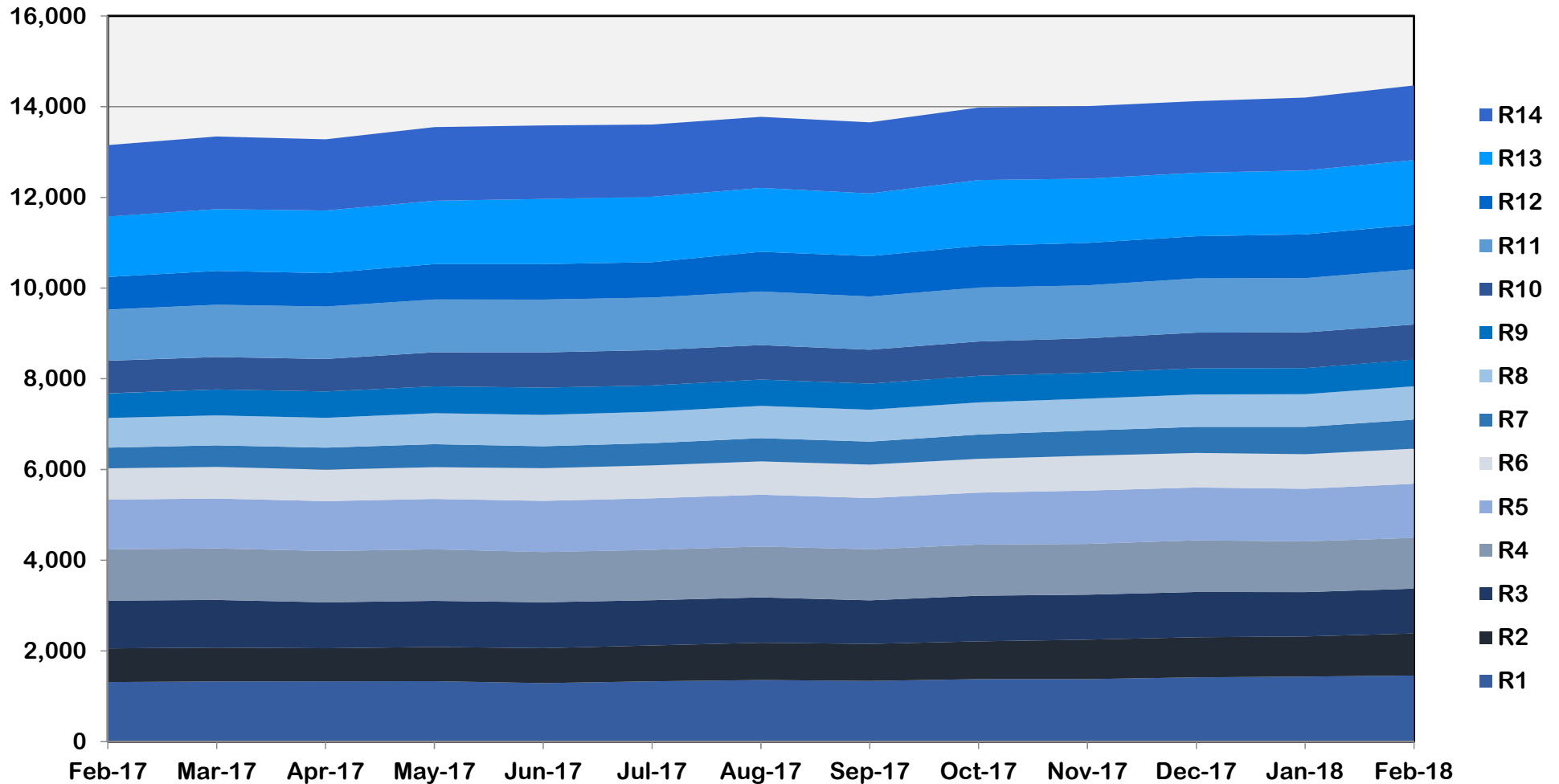
The number of children in foster care under the age of 18 increased to 14,469 during February 2018. The following slides reveal that there were 811 entries and 517 exits. On the last day of February 2018, there were 13,952 children in custody from this population. Of those who entered custody during February 2018, fifty-six children (6.9%) had a prior episode within 12 months.

### Outcome VI-A: Children in DFCS Custody Under the Age of 18 (Regional) ( February 2017 – February 2018)

The number of children in Foster Care under the age of 18 during February 2018 was 14,469. Visually, you can see that Region 14 has the highest proportion of children in custody at any point in time. During February 2018, Region 14 had 1,644 children in DFCS custody followed by Region 1 with 1,457 children and Region 13 with 1,428 children. (for regional trends, see appendix). Region 2 showed the highest change in population counts from January 2018 to February 2018 (42) which represented an 4.8% increase regionally.

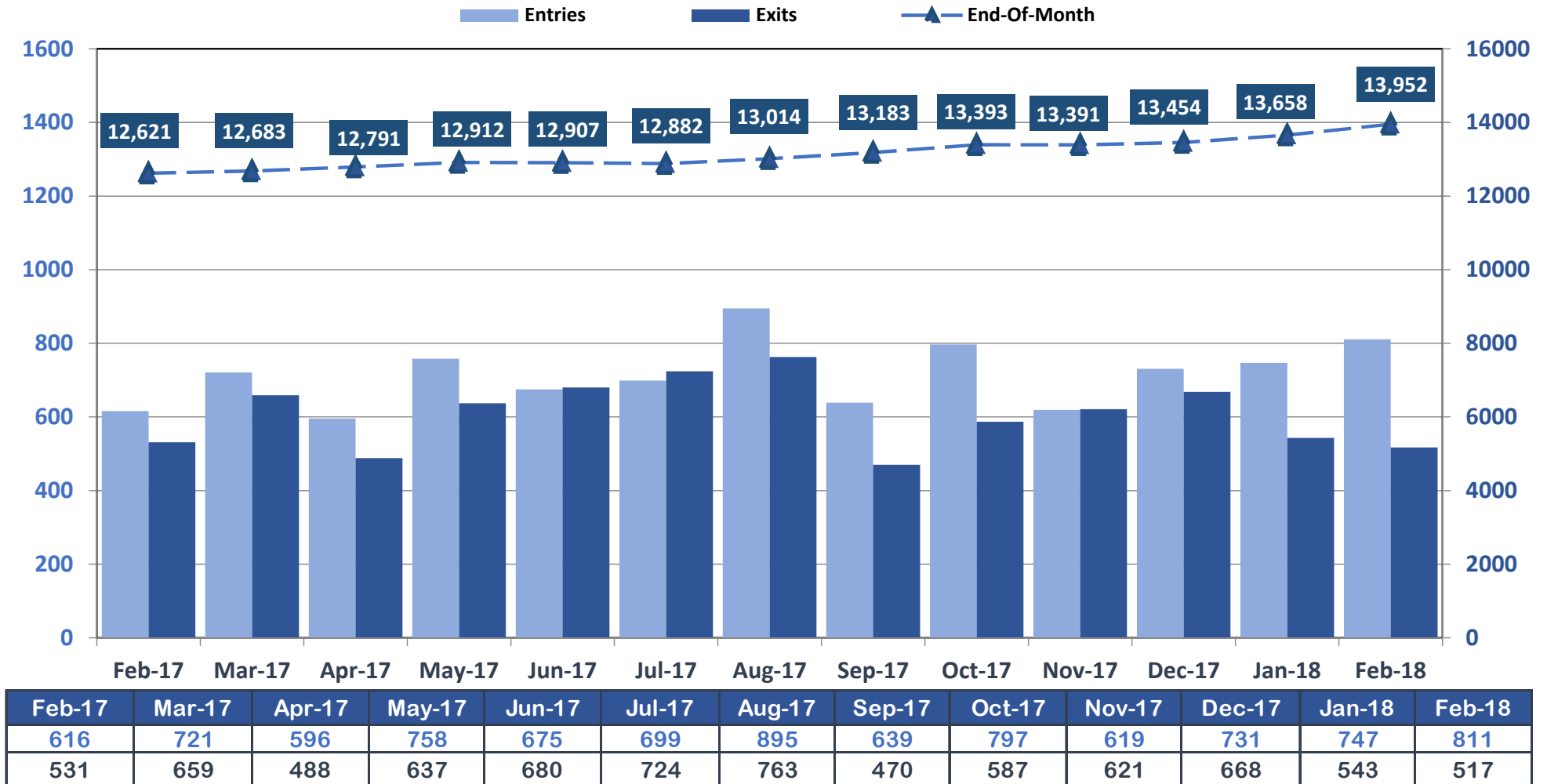

## Outcome VII: Comparison of Foster Care Entries and Exits (February 2017 – February 2018)

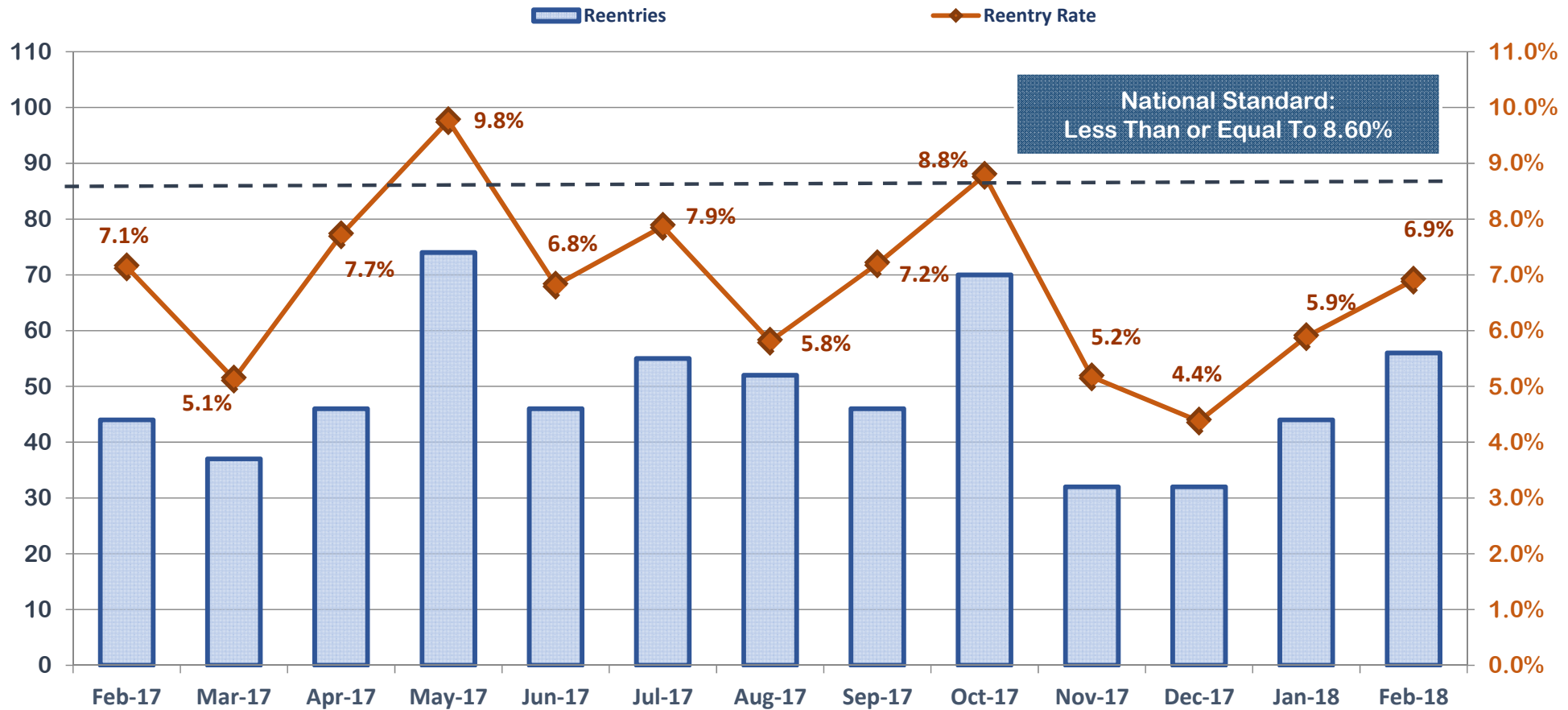
Multiple trends can be seen in this graph. There was an increase in the number of entries from June 2017 through August 2017 with a drop in September followed by increases through February 2018. Exits also increased from May 2017 through August 2017 with a decrease in September with rebounds in October 2017 through December 2017 and decreases in both January and February 2018. There was a net gain of 294 children who were removed from their homes versus those who were discharged from foster care which resulted in the overall population as of the last day of the month having an increase of 294 children from January 2018 to February 2018.



\*\*Reentries that occur within the same month are not double counted in the entries and exits on this chart. This chart represents unique population and movement into custody during the month.

### Outcome VIII: Foster Care Re-Entries (February 2017 – February 2018)

Reentries into foster care during May 2017 and October 2017 were over the national standard. For the last three months, there have been progressively more reentries from 4.4% to 6.9% which represents 75% increase in counts. The re-entry rate and number of reentries for February 2018 (6.9%) increased both in ratio and actual counts compared to January 2018's ratio. The proportion of re-entries to entries decreased during February 2018 compared to February 2017 revealing an increase in removals compared to February of last year.

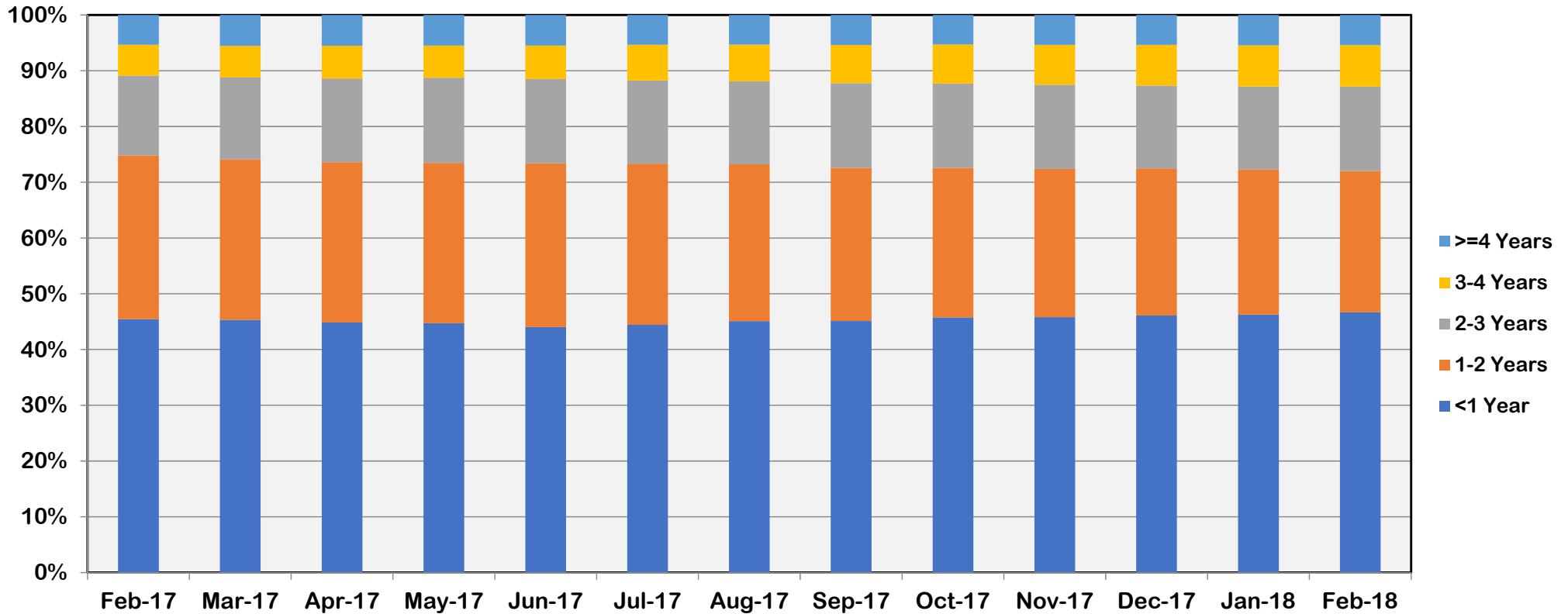

## Outcome IX: Foster Care Length of Stay (February 2017 – February 2018)

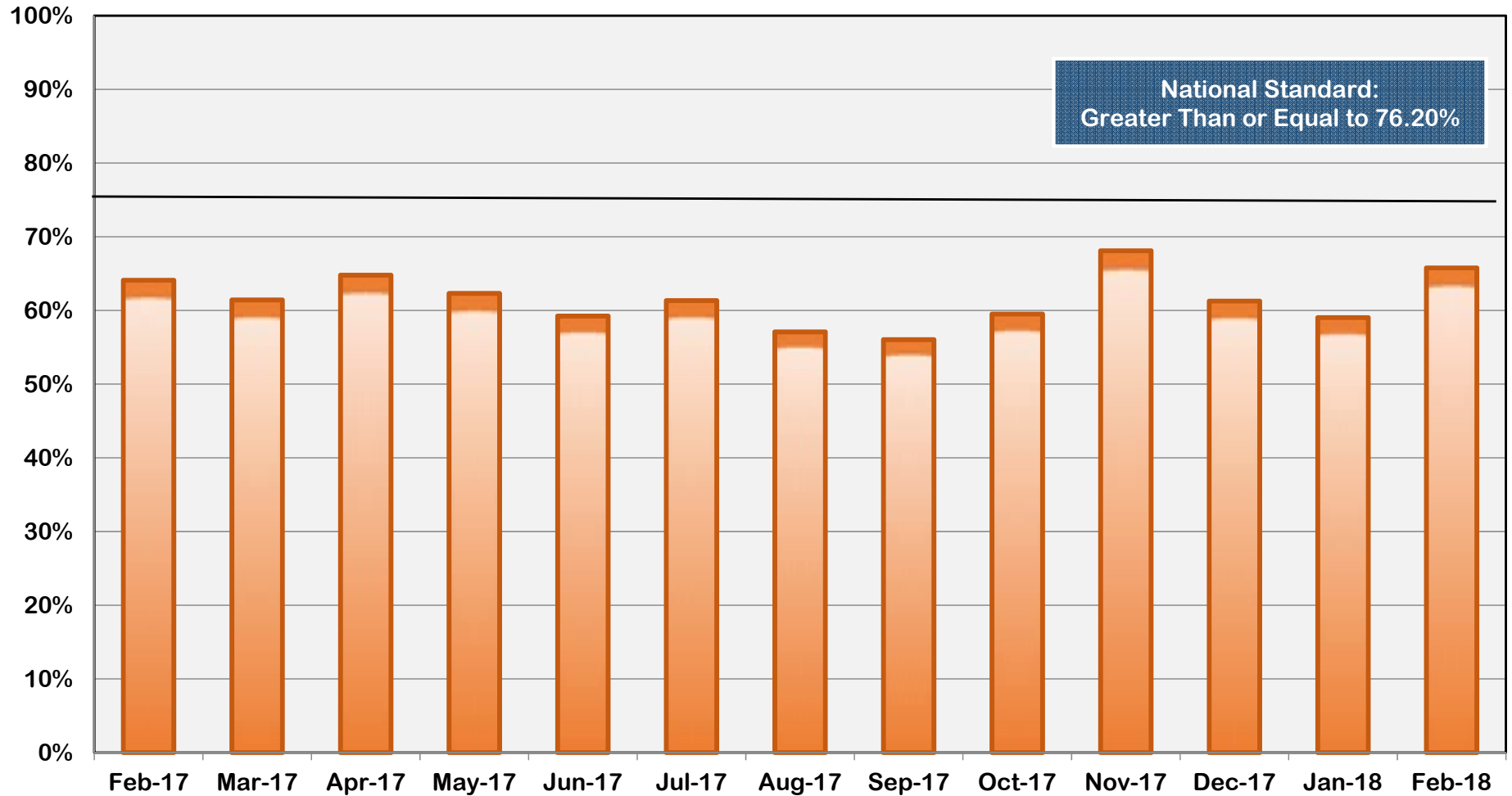
During the month of February 2018 the lengths of stay among the foster care populations for children in custody from 1 year to less than 2 years decreased by .7%. Comparison of the trend from February 2017 reveals that there are higher proportion of children who are staying in care for more than 24 months. (25% vs 28%).

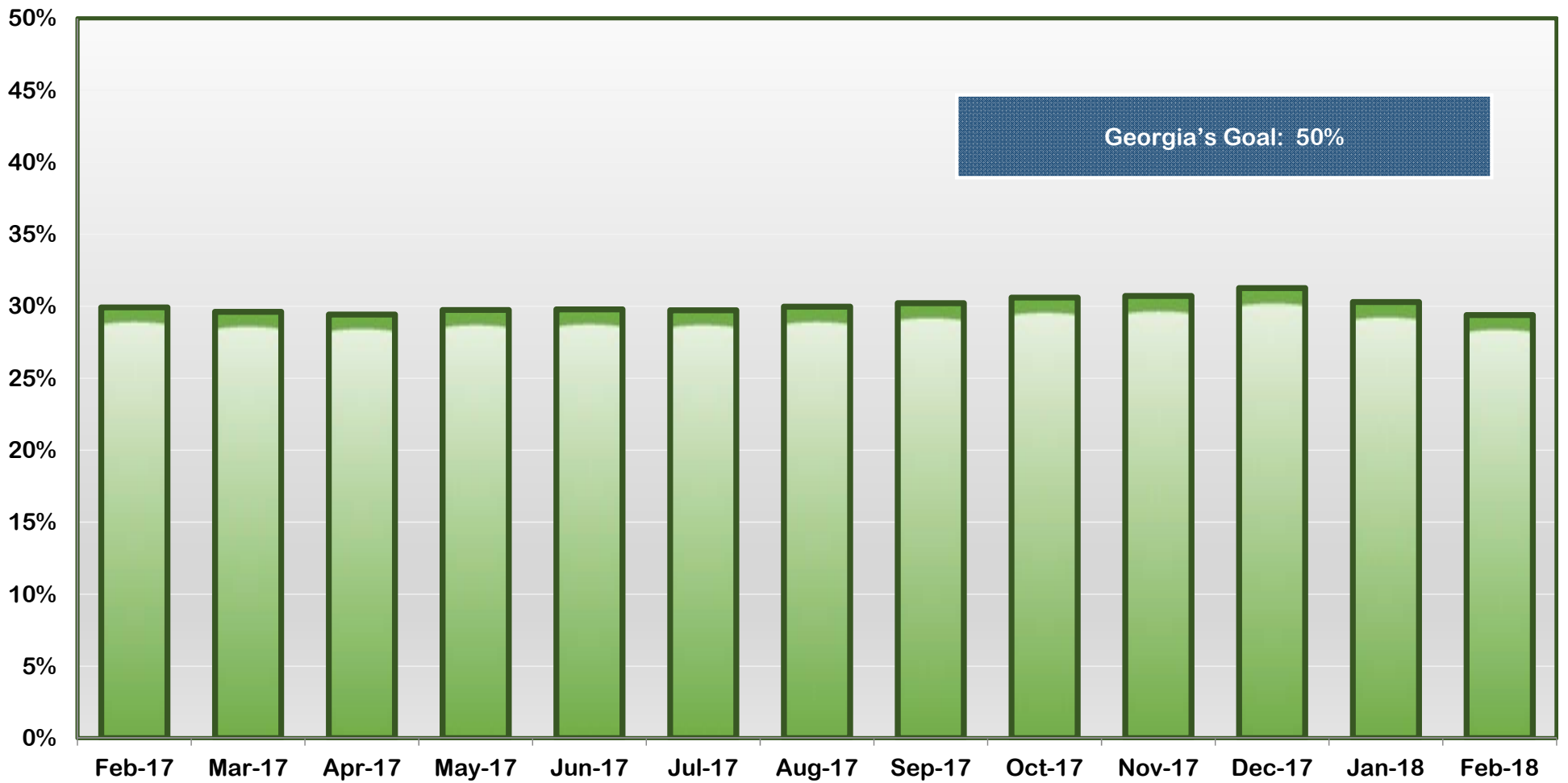
The percentage of foster children who reunified within 12 months improved from 59.0% in January 2018 to 65.8% in February 2018.

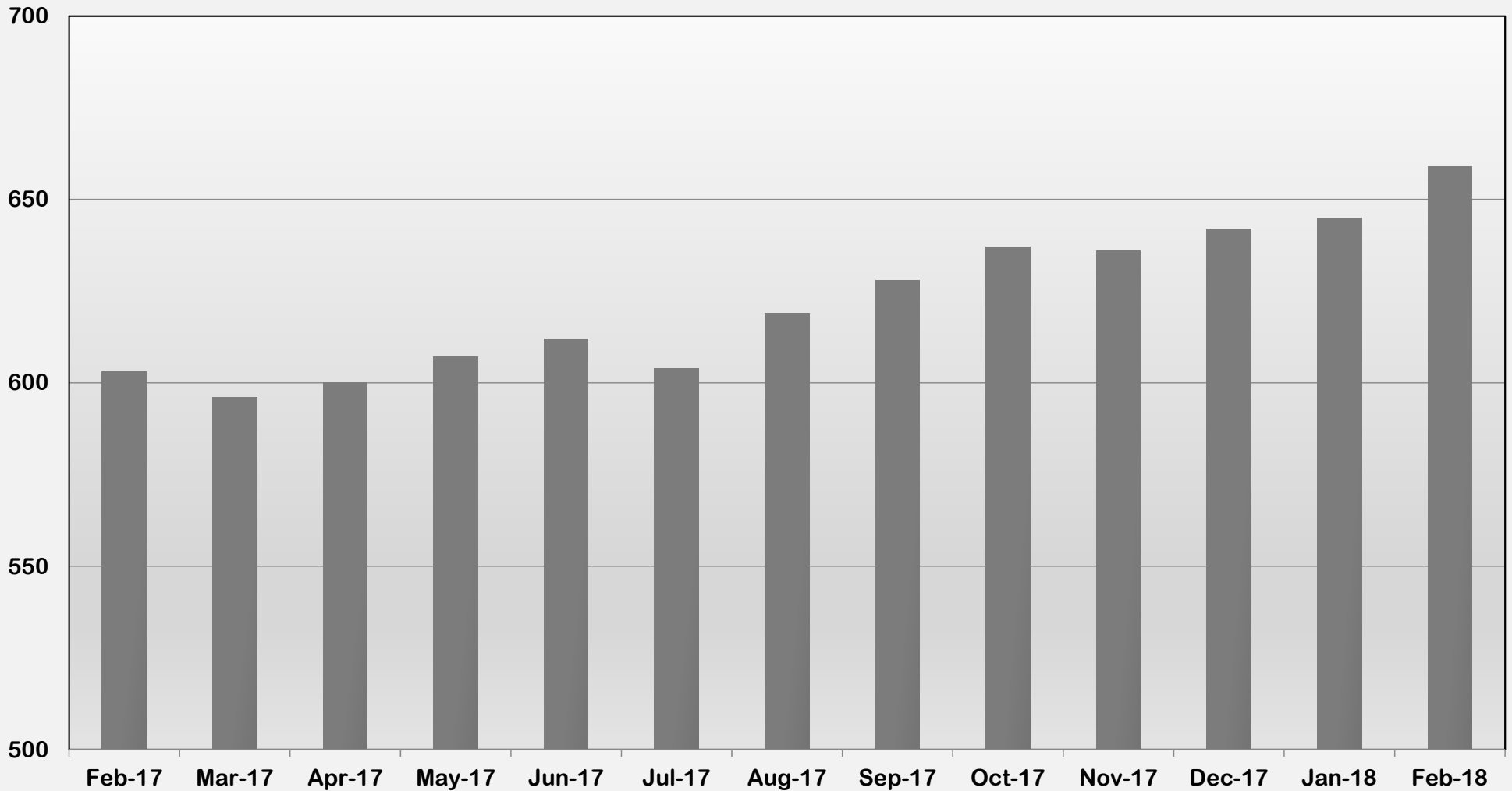
The percentage of children who were in Foster Care that were placed with relatives during the month of February 2018 decreased to 29.4%.

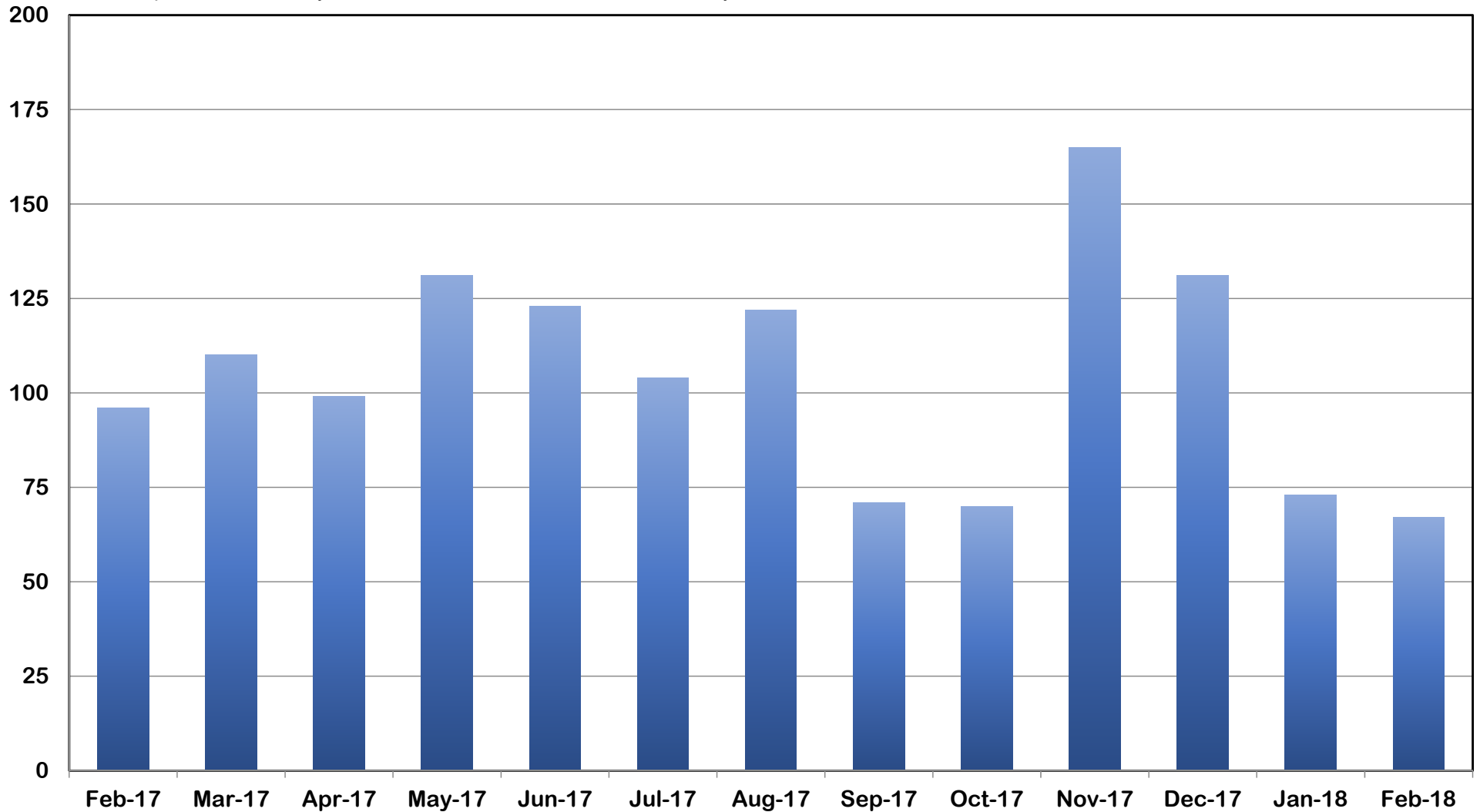

### Outcome XIII: Number of Finalized Adoptions (February 2017 – February 2018)

There were 67 foster children adopted during February 2018. This is a decrease of 30% compared to February 2017. In the next graph, the average time to finalization in February 2017 was lower than the children who finalized in February 2018 by 4.5 months. There was also a higher percentage of children who were in the permanent custody of DFCS after these finalizations in February 2017.

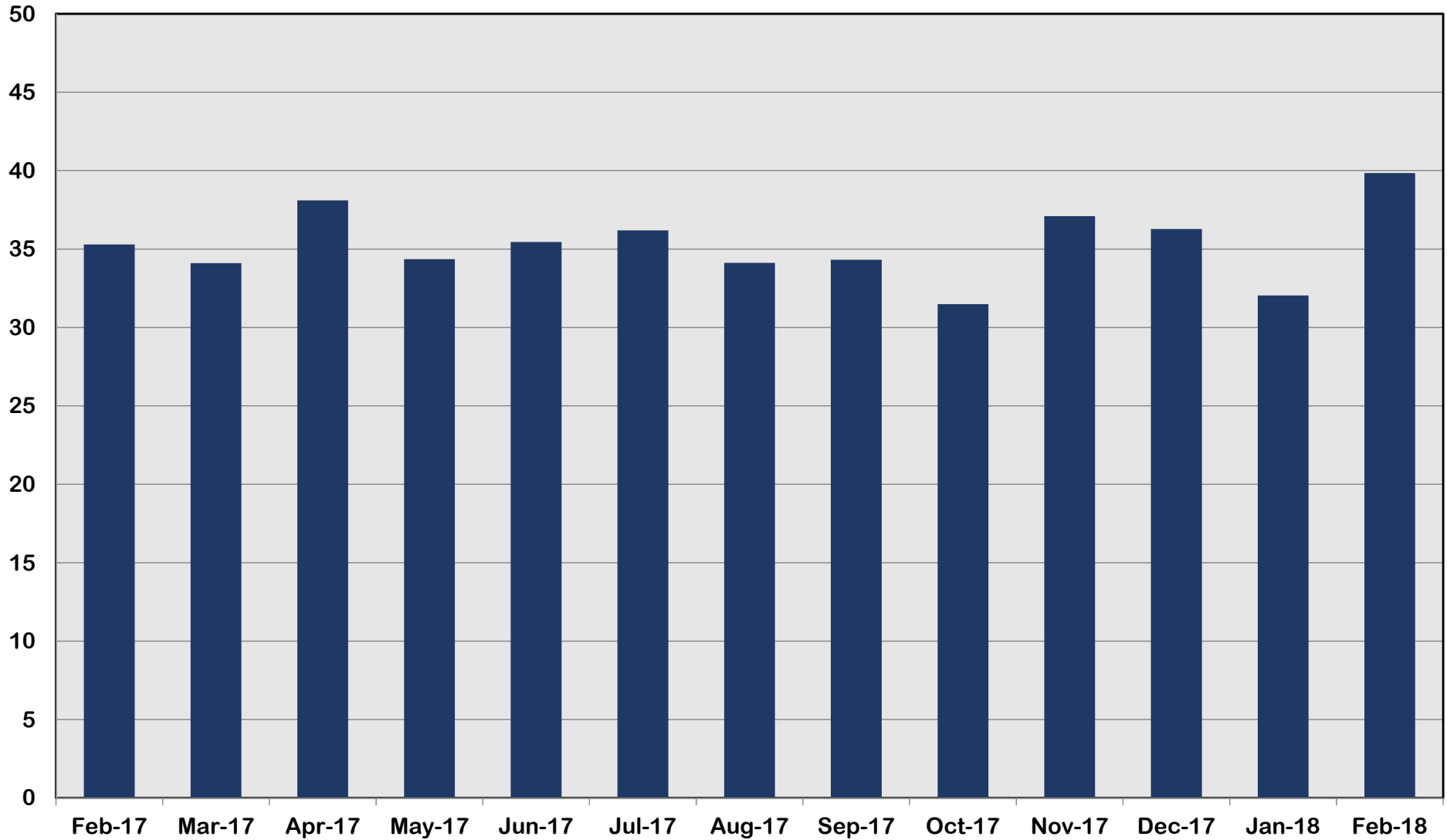

The average time to achieve finalization in February 2018 was 39.8 months.



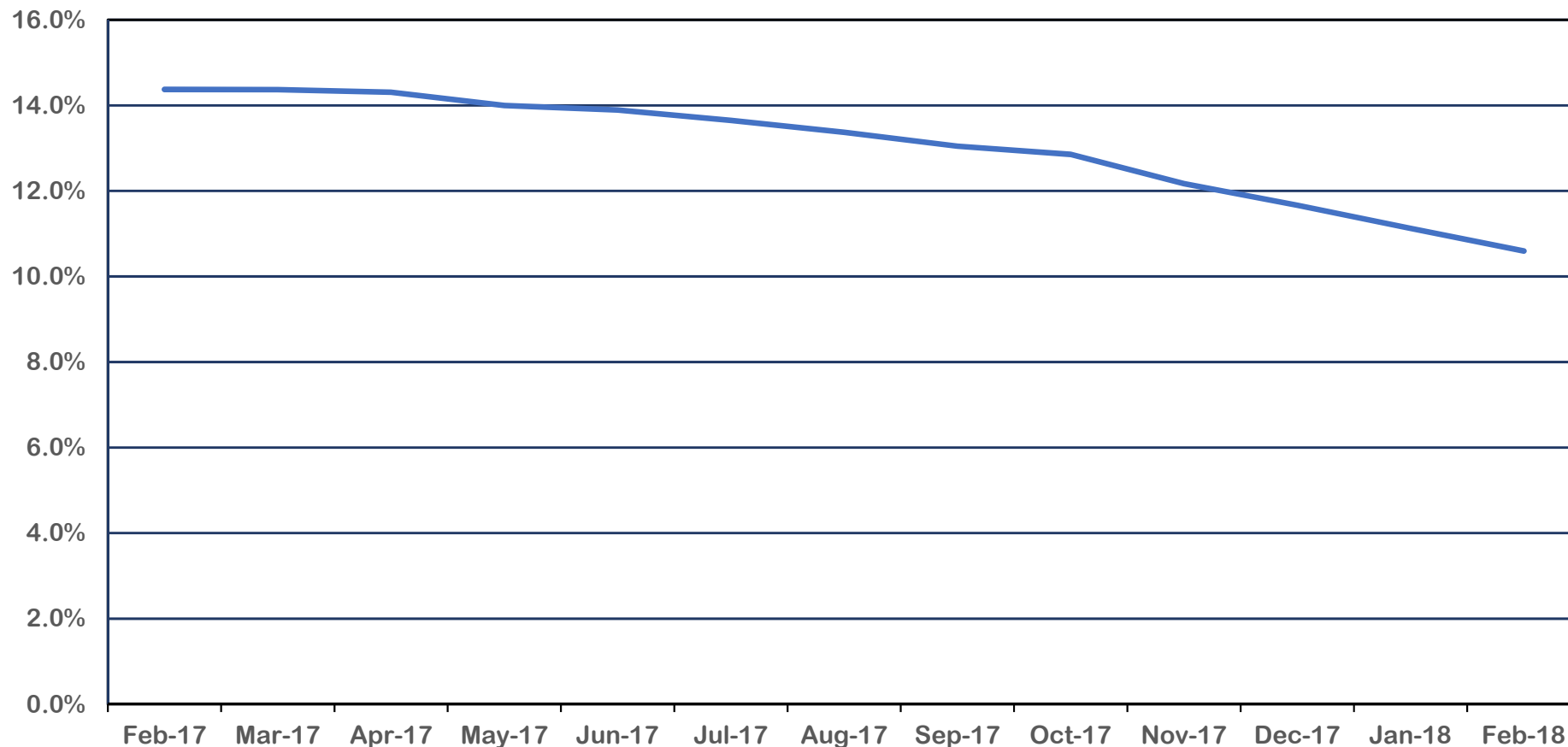

On the last day in February 2018, there were 1,474 children who had a legal status of permanent. This represented 10.6% of the total population in DFCS Custody.

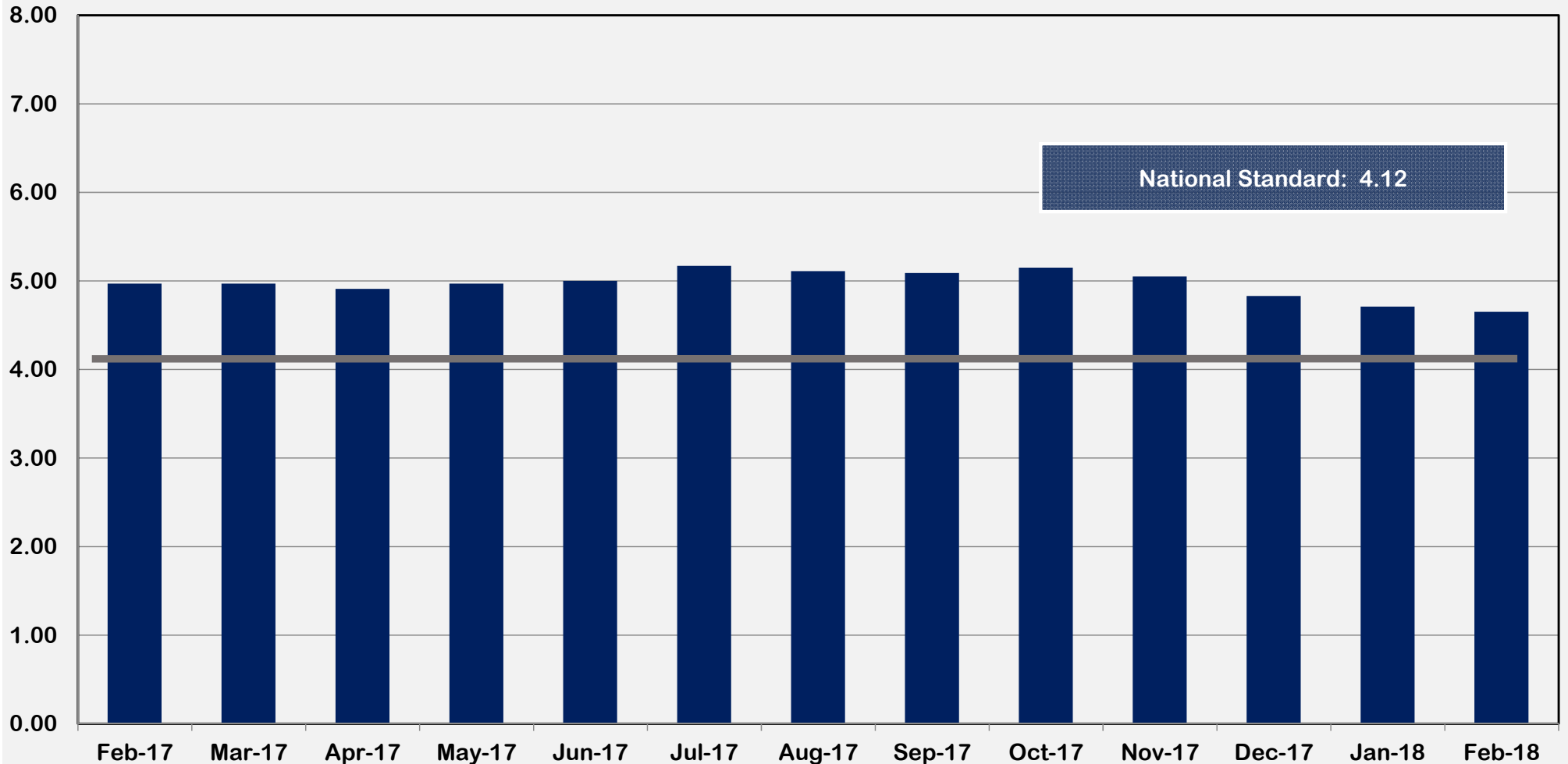

Over the last 13 months, the federal measure for stability which is the number of moves per number of days per thousand has improved from 4.97 to 4.65.



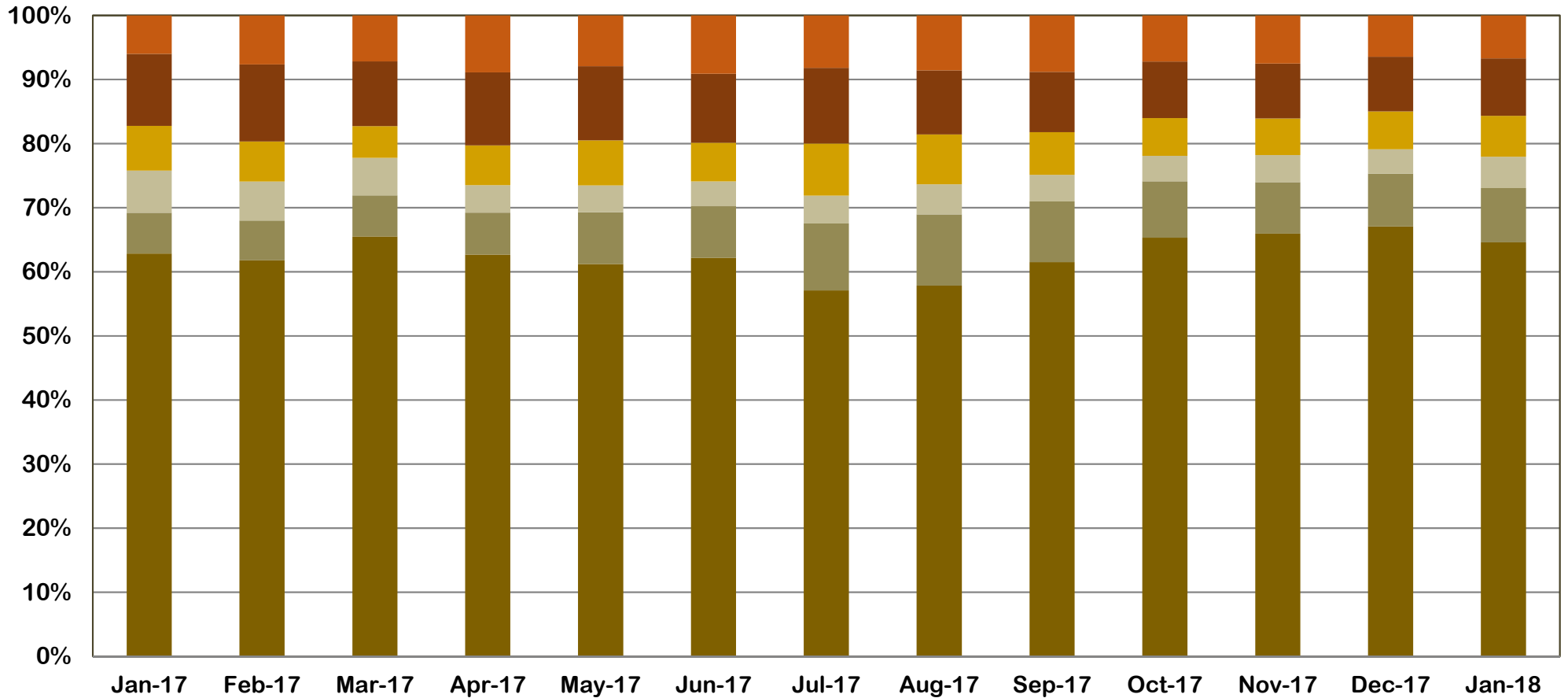
